DURANGO ECONOMY



Commercial activities, **real estate and rental services for personal, intangible property, food industry, agriculture, animal breeding, forestry, fishing, hunting and construction** are among the main productive activities in the city of Durango.

The strategic sectors in the state are: **mining, metalworking, agroindustry, wood products, clothing and auto parts production**. The main activity is manufacturing, while the highest participation sub-sector is the manufacture of transportation equipment, followed by the garment manufacturing industry.

In November, the reactivation of the construction sector and the growth of the **manufacturing industry in Durango** resulted in a growth of **6.2%**. In the same month, the national record for this activity was **-1.2%**. In the case of mining, it was **-2.2%** in the same reference month but was higher than the previous **-4.6%** which indicates a better performance in Durango for this sector.

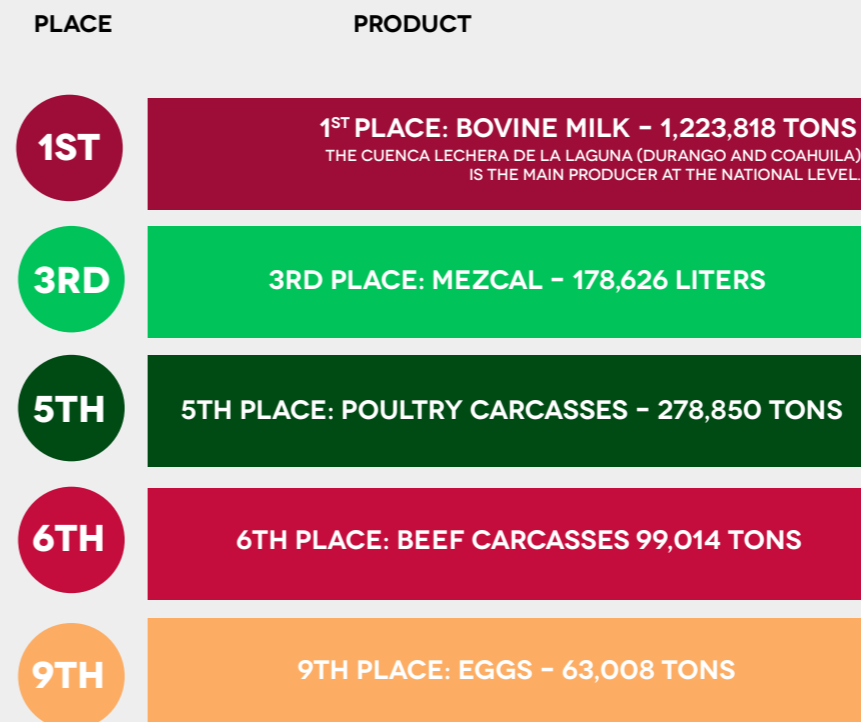
